 - i. 10 Special Education Teachers

 - ii. Has been trying not to shuffle staff as much as he can
 - iii. Job sight training for job skills
 - iv. Teach students how to Interview
 - v. Helps young adults be productive
 - vi. House set up to learn how to be productive and independent in the home
 - vii. Get on a list for adult foster care as soon as you can. Long waiting list
 - viii. All four programs offered can go up to Age 26
 - ix. These kids get to walk with their peers at graduation, but do not get their diploma until they have met their transition goals

 - ii. Short a School Social Worker and a School Psychologist
